

>>>>> Because we are convinced that **security is a common good** that must be achieved with the participation of all urban life stakeholders, and which must be based on a balance between **prevention, sanction and social cohesion**, the conference will address the issue of **governance between different territorial authorities** and the participation of the private sector and civil society - in particular citizens - in security policies



>>>>> Policy recommendations will be submitted to national governments and the EU's decision-making instances to reaffirm the role of cities and local authorities as key partners for security in Europe

>>>>> Aimed at all urban security stakeholders, the conference will bring together local, regional, national and European elected officials, civil servants, magistrates, security professionals, social workers, researchers, representatives of the private sector and civil society, experts and representatives of European institutions and international organisations




Programme
